13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The requested funds will expand the Military to Civilian Statewide Integration Program, a coordinated initiative led by the Florida Veterans Coalition that works in conjunction with transitioning service members on installations across the United States. Every service member through this program receives early, structured support through certified VA sponsors and access to housing, employment, education, healthcare, and financial resources. This funding will strengthen FVC across 67 counties, enhance suicide prevention and wellness services, and build the infrastructure needed to track outcomes statewide. The program directly supports Florida's mission to reduce veteran suicide and increase successful reintegration into the civilian workforce.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will support coordinated transition and suicide prevention services through the Florida Veterans Coalition's Community Integration Coordinator (CIC) program. Activities include recruiting and training certified VA sponsors under the Veteran Sponsorship Initiative, conducting risk assessments, and connecting transitioning service members to housing, employment, education, healthcare, and financial resources. Regional task forces will coordinate with local VSOs, nonprofits, and county agencies to ensure direct access to support. Additional services include financial literacy and wellness coaching, community education seminars, and applied suicide intervention training. The program ensures early engagement—up to 12 months before separation—and ongoing support to improve stability, resilience, and long-term veteran outcomes across Florida.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services will be provided to transitioning service members, veterans, and their families through personalized case management, peer sponsorship, and coordinated access to critical resources. Each participant will receive a customized transition plan supported by a trained VA-certified sponsor, connecting them to housing assistance, employment opportunities, education benefits, financial literacy programs, and healthcare navigation. The program will also provide suicide prevention and wellness services, including Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) and individual wellness coaching. These direct, community-based interventions ensure veterans entering Florida are supported, stabilized, and empowered to successfully reintegrate into civilian life while reducing risk factors associated with veteran suicide.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes transitioning service members, veterans, and their families relocating to or residing in Florida. The program focuses on individuals within 12 months of military separation and recently transitioned veterans at higher risk of isolation or suicide. Through statewide coordination and community partnerships, the initiative is expected to serve approximately 1,200 transitioning service members annually, with indirect benefits reaching more than 5,000 veterans and family members through access to housing, employment, education, and wellness resources.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Funding will enable the Florida Veterans Coalition to expand critical support and coordination services for transitioning service members, veterans, and their families across the state. Outcome measures will include: (1) the number of veterans and service members connected to housing, employment, education, and benefits assistance; (2) the number of individuals participating in suicide prevention, financial literacy, and wellness programs; (3) successful referrals to community and clinical partners for mental health and crisis intervention; and (4) engagement outcomes measured through partner reports, participant feedback, and verified follow-ups to ensure long-term stability and reintegration.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The Florida Veterans Coalition is committed to meeting all deliverables and performance measures outlined in the contract. With a proven history of accountability and successful statewide program delivery, FVC will implement immediate corrective actions if performance goals are not met.
