Funding will enable the Housing Authority of Pompano Beach to advance the Blanche Ely Estates project, creating sustainable housing opportunities while strengthening the community's infrastructure. These improvements will not only support the development of new homes but also promote long-term financial stability and self-sufficiency for the families who will reside there.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is low-income and senior residents, and we are expecting to serve over 800 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Infrastructure improvements, including utility access within Blanche Ely Estates, will create safer, affordable housing for low-income and senior residents. The Blanche Ely Estates project will generate local economic activity through construction jobs, contractor engagement, and increased consumer spending by new residents. The project will create short-term construction and infrastructure-related jobs, as well as long-term property management and maintenance. Blanche Ely Estates will contribute to long-term neighborhood revitalization and community pride by replacing blighted areas with high-quality, affordable housing. The methodology in which we will measure the outcome will be through resident satisfaction surveys, community development reports, and property value assessment along with engineering reports, site inspections, and compliance verification.
