4. Project/Program Description

Sudden Cardiac Arrest is the leading cause of death on school campuses, in student athletes, and arguably among all children. Research shows that 1 in 300 children have a detectable and potentially life-threatening heart condition. Recognizing this tragedy, the Legislature passed, and the Governor signed SB 1070, requiring all first-time student athletes in Florida High Schools to receive an ECG screening. Who We Play For (WWPF) brings lifesaving electrocardiogram (ECG) heart screenings to tens of thousands of students and student-athletes across every region of Florida. State support will enable WWPF to provide ECG heart screenings for 33,000 students aged 10 to 22, empowering hundreds of students and families with critical health information, creating a safer future for our youth and preventing the unimaginable.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Reduction of Sudden Cardiac Arrest in the young. Funds will be used to deliver non-invasive, 5-minute electrocardiogram (ECG) heart screenings to 33,000 young people across Florida. Research indicates 1 in 300 kids will have a detectable, life-threatening heart condition; therefore, WWPF can expect to save approximately 110 young lives. WWPF has identified over 500 children with deadly heart conditions through screenings of children who had passed their regular physicals.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Who We Play For will host heart screening events in partnership with local schools and community organizations, advancing the standard of care for 33,000 students between the ages of 10 and 22-years across the state.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

WWPF will deliver non-invasive, 5-minute electrocardiogram (ECG) heart screenings to 33,000 students across FL. The ECG readings are then sent to and read by a pediatric cardiologist, and the results are returned to the student or parent/guardian. Support is provided when next steps are needed to mitigate or eliminate any health threats to the child.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will serve up to 33,000 Florida students and student-athletes between the ages of 10 and 22, as well as their families.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Who We Play For anticipates that, of the 33,000 students that will be screened, 3% or 990 students, will be flagged for follow up care. Of this group, hundreds will be identified with minor heart conditions and approximately 110 students will have a life-threatening heart condition that the State's investment can save from a tragic ending.
