### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will allow inSIGHT Through Education, Inc to bring the Hate Ends Now Cattle Car to approximately 10,000 students at 15 high schools and colleges throughout Palm Beach County. This multi-sensory traveling Holocaust exhibit provides an immersive lesson about the history of the Holocaust (1933-1945) instilling empathy in students as they gain awareness of hatred and the harm it can cause.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding will be used to provide approximately 10,000 students at approximately 15 public high schools and colleges in Palm Beach County with the opportunity to experience the traveling Holocaust exhibit. The multi-sensory exhibit will reach approximately 1,300 Palm Beach County students per week during its 7 week tour.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Set inside a replica World War II cattle car, students will get a powerful look at the history of the Holocaust through a multi-sensory exhibit to learn testimonies of survivors as well as key events of the Holocaust through World War II artifacts with a trained educator.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

High school and/or college students in Palm Beach County will be served by this project. Approximately 10,000 students from 15 public high schools and/or colleges in Palm Beach County will have the opportunity to visit the traveling Holocaust exhibit. The multi-sensory exhibit will reach approximately 1,300 students in Palm Beach County per week during its 7 week tour.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome is that students will have increased empathy and the profound harm that hatred can cause. Attendees of the exhibit will be encouraged to complete an online survey to help measure the effectiveness of this program. Questions will gauge Holocaust knowledge levels before and after participation, the emotional impact of the exhibit on their level of empathy, and if the experience has influenced their willingness to stand up when others are mistreated or harmed. Surveys will be administered and tabulated to measure the benefits of this unique educational experience. Reports by participating teachers will also be reviewed to maximize program success.
