a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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We hope to publish a statewide curriculum with the Florida After School Program. This curriculum will be an outline and instructional manual to run Page by Page Book Drives in communities throughout the State of Florida. The goal is to teach children and school administrators how to conduct the book drives and to donate the books to local charities in a streamlined way to empower grade level readers to organize a school wide event that takes a community to complete while resulting in thousands of gently used books to enter the hands of children who may not have any books in their homes.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities will be to draft an outline of the curriculum and work with Florida After School Program's guidelines to meet their criteria of a curriculum that is publishable. This will involve using specific software for publishing and graphic designers to create the illustrations, layout, and format.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct service will be to provide a free Page by Page After School Curriculum available to all that will show the community how to enrich the literacy skills for all members of their community by operating a book collection and redistributing the books into the hands of children. It will also show grade level reading children that they have the power to make a difference in the world and are empowered to help others.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is every child in the State of Florida who can either benefit from free books or a child that wants to learn how to help others. A third party that benefits are the members of a community because this curriculum is a community event which brings people together to help others.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

We have circulated over 800,00+ book to more than 3.5 million children throughout the world. We expect by creating this curriculum, we feel we can impact potentially 18 million children in the State of Florida, either by enriching their literacy skills by having increased access to books or by teaching the children about literacy, being made aware of the need of literacy for all, or teaching them organizational skills to make a difference.
