Our equation for success includes providing after school and summer programming in four areas of impact: Academic Success, Health & Well-being, Character & Leadership, and Life & Workforce Readiness. Capital improvements will ensure that our members continue to have a safe space to learn, develop and reach their full potential as productive, caring, and responsible citizens.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will enable the construction of Carol Boies Teen Center, complete repairs, and renovation of the Club to create a new designated specialty space to serve members. This initiative will ensure we continue providing out-of-school time activities that address the educational, personal, and vocational needs of underserved, at-risk youth in Broward County.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Clubs provide high-yield educational, healthy lifestyle and leadership programs to youth with both environmental and individual risk factors. Our programs strive to have an impact on our members' development, while seeking to empower youth to lead productive lives by ensuring that they have the proper skills to pursue future education and careers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes economically disadvantaged individuals and at-risk youth, specifically grade school and high school students, with an estimated 200–400 members expected to be served through this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will serve youth, providing a safe and supportive environment that promotes overall well-being and future success. Members will benefit from improved physical health through free nutritious meals and fitness programs, and enhanced mental health through evidence-based initiatives that build resilience, coping skills, and emotional awareness. Educational outcomes will strengthen through homework support, project-based learning, and technology, while cultural enrichment programs such as art, music, and recording sessions expand creative expression. Substance prevention and positive youth development programs equip members with the confidence and refusal skills to make healthy choices and avoid risky behaviors. Collectively, these efforts help divert youth from the juvenile justice system, foster leadership, and prepare them to thrive in school, career, and life.
