13. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose will be to provide a safe and family-friendly environment for parents and children involved in the local foster care system to visit with one another allowing for maintained relationships, attachment, child nurturing, and reduction of trauma. Along with those critical reasons, the ultimate goal is to increase the chances of family reunification as quickly as it is safe to do so. A research study by Davis, Landverk, Newton, and Ganger, "Parental Visiting and Foster Care Reunification," found maternal visiting at the recommended level was the strongest predictor of reunification among the five study variables, indicating that a child visited by the mother as recommended was approximately 10 times more likely to be reunified (Children and Youth Services Journal, 1996).

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

ChildNet will provide supervised visitation for parent-child visits involved in the child welfare system in Palm Beach County where a child has been removed from the parent's care and custody due to abuse, neglect, and/or abandonment. Service array delivered by Visitation Monitors, Visitation Specialists, and Transportation Specialists will include scheduling visits, coordinating visitation logistics, providing direct in-person supervision of the visits, transporting children to and from visits as needed, and developing visitation reports for the dependency courts. In order to accommodate the additional number of visits, the space will be expanded and staffing will be enhanced.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services to the citizens will include supervision of family visitation, scheduling, transportation, and completion of required reports to the court.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population includes both children and parents with an open legal dependency case in Palm Beach County and the child(ren) has been removed from the parent's care and custody due to abuse, neglect, and/or abandonment. Ages of the children may range from 0-18; parents may be any age. ChildNet's Palm Beach visitation program will serve 152 children annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Supervised Visitation will be provided for a minimum of 152 children annually (38 children quarterly). At least 80% of target will be achieved each quarter and annually. The measure will be determined by dividing the total number of children who received supervised visitation by the number of program participants.
