The installation of a new 60" RCP culvert with emergency sluice gate and telemetry system (24/7 remote operation) within Basin S-3 will allow for more effective pre and post storm draw down for major rainfall events.	328,892

- 13. Program Performance
  - a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The purpose of the funds would be the modification of 2 sluice gates located at the S-2 and S-7 pump station to increase their size and flow capacity as well as the installation of a new emergency sluice gate within a neighborhood in SBDD's basin S3 to be used for emergency discharge in the event of a large scale incoming storm. The new gate will also allow for a built in discharge point for SBDD's mobile stormwater pump to use in emergency pre- and poststorm operations.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project will provide 2 modified sluice gates to be controlled automatically through SBDD's telemetry system within the pump stations and a new culvert and sluice gate with telemetry to allow for automatic control of the emergency gate as well. These improvements will allow for a better level of service within SBDD Basins S-2, S-3, S7, and S-13 through increased ability to draw down levels pre-storm to create more capacity in the lake and canal system. This will allow for flood levels to be lower, emergency access routes to remain open and accessible longer, and the time frame that residents may be trapped in their homes and businesses closed due to flooding to be reduced.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

SBDD will be provided real-time water level monitoring with an increased ability to provide pre-storm and post-storm drawdowns which will enhance the level of service of flood protection (both stages and duration) for the citizens and businesses within the region.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

According to 2020 Census data the total population effected by this project is 129,966 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will provide added flood protection within the region. By lowering surface water levels within the interconnected lakes and canal system, SBDD will have the ability to perform a faster more effective pre-storm draw down via gravity within the SBDD Basins 2, 3, and 7. The residents and businesses will benefit from the pre-storm draw down which will lower the lake levels and provide additional, critical, storm-water storage within the community faster than what was previously possible to ensure there is optimum storage even with shorter notice for storm warnings. The extra storage capacity will allow for businesses to remain open longer, for residents to return to work sooner and roadways being less negatively impacted during the storm event and recovering sooner post-storm.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

SBDD will have a liquidated damages clause of \$500 per day after the allotted contract time has expired within its
