13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The City is undertaking redeveloping Provost Park in the Diamond Square Community. This project represents a long-overdue investment in equity, safety, and inclusion for an underserved community. The City has already invested over \$1.7 million to redevelop a portion of the park and now is adding in new accessible playground equipment, new soccer mini-pitches, and a fitness court. This project supports healthier lifestyles, deters crime and creates a safe, welcoming environment for residents.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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With this redevelopment project, Provost Park will have accessible playground equipment, the only playground with this type of equipment in the City, new facilities for youth soccer programming, and fitness equipment that can allow individual and group fitness activity. This project supports healthier lifestyles, deters crime, and creates a safe space for youth and families.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Access to healthy recreational alternatives that can provide a safe environment for families in the Cocoa community and another alternative for youth to have access to a sport that can provide opportunities for continuing education. Also, the accessible playground equipment provides direct recreational opportunities for handicap youth in the Cocoa community that don't have this type of equipment.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly, youth and economically disadvantaged persons in the surrounding community that will utilize the facilities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve physical and mental health, protect the general public from harm, reduce recidivism, reduce substance abuse, and divert from the criminal and juvenile justice system by providing recreational opportunities. This can be measured through usage reports.
