1. Project Title Brevard County - Indialantic Stormwater Drainage Project Design - Phase 7

4. Project/Program Description

Funds are being requested for design of Phase 7 - Sand Dollar and Sand Pine Road. The planning study recommended drainage improvements consisting of lining of the aging Corrugated Metal Pipes (CMP); replacement of curb inlets and associated piping; the addition of a second inlet to ensure adequate inlet capacity for areas to the west; and replacement of drainage structure in residential backyards. Construction was funded by County and ARPA funding for Phase 1 in the approximate amount of \$3,524,518. The contractor was recently issued a construction notice to proceed for Phase 1. Brevard County is also anticipating receipt of FY 26 State funding through FDEP totaling \$1,764,078 to construct the Phase 2 (\$3.5M) project with a 50% County match. The County is awaiting notification of funding through a federal appropriation for the Phase 4 (\$4M) project (50% County match). The overall project is (9) nine phases and is estimated at approximately \$22M.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The specific purpose to be achieved by this funding request is to design improvements to alleviate flooding that occurs along Sand Dollar Road and Sand Pine Road in Brevard's Stormwater District 4 Indialantic Region. The project will also improve water quality in the Indian River Lagoon by improving stormwater resiliency in the area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Proposed improvements include:

- Lining of aging Corrugated Metal Pipes (CMP)
- Replacement of two (2) pairs of curb inlets and associated piping along Sand Dollar Road and Sand Pine Road
- Addition of second pair of inlets along the streets to ensure adequate inlet capacity for depressional areas to the west
- Drainage structure impacts at residential backyards may require replacement

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed improvements will alleviate flooding issues in neighborhoods within the Indialantic region.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are the residents of the area around the identified areas of flooding including Sand Dollar Road and Sand Pipes Road. Approximately 5000 individuals will be served by the overall proposed improvements.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit or outcome of the project is the replacement and/or upgrades the drainage systems to reach an acceptable level of service for flood control throughout the project area. The outcome will be measured during rainy conditions in the area to determine whether the improvements alleviated flooding by allowing the runoff to flow to the three (3) existing outfalls.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The County's contracts include comprehensive provisions that address failure to perform, including liquidated damages for not achieving Substantial Completion, and termination. In addition, the County will complete a post-design evaluation of the consultant/contractor and submit the form to the County's Purchasing Services.
