13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of the funds requested is to provide a state of the art career technical college that will provide an opportunity for career enhancement and job placement for Brevard adult learners and surrounding county's residents.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The activities and services will provide a facility that will expand post-secondary career and technical education program offerings, including IT with a focus on cybersecurity, health care pathways, and advanced manufacturing. This will enhance our existing CDL training facility that encompasses auto and diesel mechanic programs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The services to be provided are career certificate programs in the area of IT with a focus on cybersecurity, health care pathways, and advanced manufacturing. Other certifications will be offered based on local workforce and supply chain needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

We will serve our adult learner population within BACE and citizens in the surrounding community, targeting the population of jobless, economically disadvantaged, at-risk youth, and currently and formerly incarcerated persons. We expect to serve over 500 Brevard County residents with these career certificate programs and continue to increase yearly.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit to the community is to fill job vacancies and upskill current job seekers. As reported by Career Source's Information Technology Industry Profile there will be 81,838 annual job openings for IT by 2030. One reports projected job openings by 2033 in the area of health care to be over 100,000 for medical assistant alone. There are 30,200 projected job openings in the area of machinists for technician level jobs. This number increases as skill sets change in the area of advanced manufacturing. The goal of the proposed program is to serve over 400 students per year. BACE will track data by tracking certification completer's, surveying completers, and analyzing data from the regional occupation demand lists to help determine programs that will benefit the employer and the community.
