The project will fund construction of a new basketball practice facility and the conversion of existing courts into a women's volleyball arena. Renovations will include updated training, recovery, locker, office, and equipment spaces. These improvements support daily athletic operations and enhance the overall student-athlete experience.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide citizens with access to enhanced collegiate athletic events, including a modern women's volleyball arena with expanded seating. It will also support community engagement through camps, clinics, and youth programs hosted in the upgraded facilities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes student-athletes in the men's and women's basketball programs and the women's volleyball program, along with coaches and support staff. Indirectly, the facilities will serve spectators, community members, and youth participants, with an estimated 2,000–3,000 individuals benefiting annually through events, training, and programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is an improved quality of education and athletic experience for student-athletes, along with enhanced program under Title IX. This will be measured through student-athlete academic performance, retention and graduation rates, satisfaction surveys, and usage metrics of the new and renovated facilities.
