Through its 100 Churches Initiative, FOF mobilizes, organizes, and equips local churches to care for vulnerable foster children as a compassion ministry of the local church, helping them to recruit, train, and support the foster families within their congregation. State funding in FY 2026-2027 would equip FOF's Initiative to scale up foster care family capacity and wrap around services in Central Florida (Orange, Osceola, and Seminole), East Central Florida (Flagler, Putnam, Volusia, Brevard), as well as immediate surrounding counties when resources bleed over. FOF will continue to fund at scale one-third of its operating costs from local communities.

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#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will expand the capacity of high-quality foster families in our community. Through our Community of Care model, we will recruit, train, equip, and sustain families who are willing to open their homes to vulnerable children. Unlike traditional strategies, our model has proven more effective - recruiting three foster families for every one brought in through the legacy system. Our process, systems, and tools provide families with more than just training; they offer a full circle of support that helps parents remain engaged and successful in fostering. In addition to foster families, we will grow our volunteer base to strengthen wrap-around support for kinship caregivers, foster families, and the children they serve. We will continue to build on the progress of our Citizen Review Panel initiative in Brevard and expand to Orange, which accelerates the path to permanency for youth in care. More children will be placed in stable, safe, and loving homes where they can thrive.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Expansion of the 100 Churches foster care training initiative in targeted communities in a 7-county region which will provide families with more than just training; we will provide a full circle of support to help parents remain engaged and successful in fostering. In addition, we will grow our volunteer base to strengthen wrap-around support for kinship caregivers and the children they care for.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Building on last year's program, professionally managed and trained volunteers provide individual caregiver support and help with respite care, meals, items needed for new foster children entering the home, invitations to regularly scheduled events and trainings, self-growth and improvement sessions.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project are foster children and foster/kinship families. Over 2,000 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The 100 Churches initiative moves children to permanency faster - whether to family members, their parents, or adoption with a 90% foster parent retention rate with zero cases of substantiated child maltreatment.
