4. Project/Program Description

The City of Palm Bay is the owner and operator of the Range, a public safety facility that serves residents, businesses and visitors throughout the region. This facility functions as a premier training site for law enforcement agencies across Central Florida, impacting over 8.8 million residents. This new development will honor Sgt. Frank Tobar and will establish a Citizens Police Academy program designed to promote public safety through education, transparency and community engagement. This initiative supports multiple Legislative priorities, including SB1804 and SB1880, by enhancing law enforcement training, providing tools to combats serious crime and protecting its citizens. The project aligns with priorities set by, Department of Justice (DOJ), Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers (FLETC), and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). It will strengthen inter-agency interoperability, support intelligence-policing strategies and improve rapid response capabilities.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Assist the City modernize the Range, and provide better equipment for our officers and those from partner agencies. The training facility will promote officers to respond safely, effectively, and professionally, ensuring the protection of both law enforcement personnel and the communities we serve. Increase public safety and emergency response is the overall benefit and outcome while increasing competence, confidence and community orientation of law Enforcement professionals by providing scenario-driven training in deescalation, crisis communication and procedural justice which will increase the likelihood of peaceful outcomes, strengthens legitimacy and build public trust. Regular, structured training sessions enhance officer safety, decision-making, and tactical response, reducing risk during high-stress situations.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Assist the enhancement of the current features: 40-Acres of Land, Live Fire Shoot House, 50 Yard Firearms Range, Rifle Range (100 Yard and 400 Yard), Search and Rescue Dive Pond, Skills and Obstacle Training Course, 60 Foot Tactical Rappel Tower, & Training Simulator. The site will continue to provide law enforcement and fire-rescue agencies a centralized, modern, and comprehensive training facility for all disciplines of public safety.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Range-Training Facility functions as a central hub for regional agencies, bridging training gaps, especially for small towns and rural departments that often lack access to a high-quality simulation environment. Strengthens disaster and major event preparedness- including for mutual aid deployments. Integrate state-of-the-art simulation technology, live defensive tactics environments, and scenario-driven tactical facility that will mimic the complexities of real-world encounters through scenario-based experiences.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will impact all residents, businesses and visitors of Palm Bay as well as other neighboring jurisdictions who benefit from the training facility. There are over 8.8 million residents in the Central Florida region.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The City will ensure that the project meets rigorous standards of fiscal efficiency, sustainability, and equitable access. This will be measured by the reduction in crime statistics overall, and efficient and effective response to events. Advocate, promote and facilitate continuous education and skills development for local, state, and federal Law Enforcement Officers.
