13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The primary goal of the new Animal Care Center is to provide a safe, temporary refuge for lost, abandoned, and mistreated animals while actively working to reunite them with their owners or find them permanent, loving homes. This mission extends beyond mere housing. Core objectives include animal medical care, welfare, relieving overcrowded accommodations, public safety and health, reunification and homing services, facilitating adoptions and rescues, enforcing animal control laws, and educating the public.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Funds will provide for construction of a modern Animal Care Center that offers significant improvements in animal welfare, operational efficiencies, staff morale, and community engagement. The facility will deliver a modern infrastructure (zoned HVAC and LED lighting), improved safety, better housing of animals, reduced animal stress, expanded programs, and a welcoming environment to the public.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This new Animal Care Center will provide citizens with services focusing on animal control and public safety, animal

welfare and care, and community outreach and education programs. These services include stray animal management, lost & found support, animal cruelty response, shelter and veterinarian care, spay & neuter education, adoption and foster programs, and volunteer opportunities. d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served? This new Animal Care Center will serve all residents of Brevard County and their animals in need. e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured? The expected benefits and outcomes of constructing a new, modern Animal Care Center in Brevard County are centered on significantly improving animal welfare, increasing operational efficiencies, and enhancing community engagement. The key benefits of this facility will be improved animal health and well-being, streamlined operational efficiencies, stronger community involvement and volunteerism, and expanded services and educational opportunities. The best measure of success will be the success rate of adoptions and an increase of employee morale and volunteers.
