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### 4. Project/Program Description

The project will support Step Up Suncoast's acquisition of its leased facility, ensuring uninterrupted access to vital programs for low-to-moderate-income residents. Step Up Suncoast provides housing and utility assistance, early childhood education, family support, career attainment programs, and other essential services that strengthen local economic stability. Ownership redirects \$673,452 annually—previously spent on rent, taxes, and admin costs—into direct services and program growth, totaling nearly \$7 million over a decade. Securing the facility provides a permanent base, eliminating disruption risks and strengthening operational stability for Florida's working families, seniors, and at-risk populations. Step Up Suncoast will leverage \$6.15 million in matching federal, local, and private funds, demonstrating broad community support and ensuring long-term sustainability aligned with Florida's priorities for economic development, housing stabilization, and impactful local services.

Upon acquisition, the facility will be owned by Step Up Suncoast, Inc, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit led by a tripartite Board comprised of representatives from the private sector, local government, and low-income community, which ensures broad community input and oversight. There are no individual or outside entity owners; all ownership and governance reside with Step Up Suncoast, which is dedicated exclusively to its mission and delivery of vital services.

### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The funds requested will be used to purchase Step Up Suncoast, Inc.'s primary facility. This acquisition will eliminate annual lease payments and redirect approximately \$673,452 per year into direct services for low- to moderate-income residents, including housing, education, and employment support. Facility ownership will provide long-term savings, ensure uninterrupted program delivery, and allow Step Up Suncoast to expand its impact and serve the community more efficiently.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Step Up Suncoast, Inc. provides education, individualized coaching, referrals, and financial assistance to individuals and families working to overcome crisis situations and achieve long-term economic self-sufficiency. The organization offers comprehensive services tailored to the needs of the entire household. Through the acquired facility, Step Up Suncoast will continue delivering a broad array of programs, including housing and utility assistance, early childhood education, family stabilization, career development, and income tax preparation services. These wraparound services empower low- to moderate-income residents by addressing immediate needs and supporting sustainable pathways out of poverty. The secure, permanent facility will enable Step Up Suncoast to expand its capacity, ensure uninterrupted service delivery, and maximize community impact with enhanced resource efficiency.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services provided to citizens through this appropriation project will include housing and utility financial assistance, disaster recovery support, home weatherization, free tax preparation and filing, career attainment services, and parenting education and support. The project also anchors the delivery of year-round, center-based early childhood education—encompassing nutrition and developmental screenings—for children aged five and younger. These services are designed to address both immediate needs and longer-term self-sufficiency for individuals and families, ensuring holistic support for our community's most vulnerable residents.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project is low- to moderate-income (LMI) residents across the Suncoast region, including households experiencing financial hardship, families with young children, seniors, and individuals seeking economic self-sufficiency. The project is expected to serve over 6,000 unduplicated individuals annually through direct services, with cumulative impact continuing to grow throughout and beyond the 20-year mortgage period. By anchoring core services in a permanent, community-based facility, Step Up Suncoast will effectively support thousands of vulnerable citizens each year and strengthen the region's economic resiliency for decades to come.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The primary benefit of this project is the redirection of approximately \$673,000 in annual facility costs into expanded direct services for low- to moderate-income citizens. Immediate, quantifiable cost savings will be realized through property tax exemptions, reduced rent payments, and minimized lease administration expenses. For clients, expected outcomes include improved wages and career prospects, increased financial and housing literacy, reduced home energy bills, enhanced health and safety, and better school readiness and age-appropriate development for young children.

Outcomes will be measured using a combination of client surveys, developmental screenings, home energy audits, home evaluations, and classroom performance scores. These tools will enable Step Up Suncoast to track and report client progress in line with established best practices for service delivery and impact evaluation.
