a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funds will support the City of Miramar's Lift Station Improvements, upgrades and rehabilitation, which upgrades over 130 lift stations citywide.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The project will fund construction and rehabilitation of lift station components including pumps, valves, wetwells, telemetry systems, and supporting infrastructure. Activities include replacement of aging equipment, preventative maintenance upgrades, and compliance-related improvements.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide residents with improved wastewater management, reduced risk of sewage overflows, and enhanced environmental protection. This directly benefits citizens through safer neighborhoods, reduced health hazards, and more reliable utility service.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project serves the entire population of Miramar, approximately 135,000 residents, as well as businesses and institutions connected to the City's wastewater system. This includes schools, hospitals, commercial centers, industrial facilities, and municipal buildings that rely on consistent and secure wastewater infrastructure to operate effectively. By safeguarding service reliability, the project not only protects public health and the environment but also ensures uninterrupted operations for critical institutions and supports the City's economic vitality.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected outcomes include improved wastewater system reliability, fewer emergency repairs, reduced regulatory citations, and extended infrastructure lifespan. Success will be measured by tracking reduction in system failures, frequency of emergency repairs, compliance with EPA/DEP standards, and operational cost savings.
