13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

GEM's headquarters, located in Doral, Florida is fully-equipped to respond immediately to disasters, and with partners such as Good360, Amazon, Publix, & many others, GEM is able to bring aid into the most devastated areas & most vulnerable populations as quickly and efficiently. GEM's goal on the ground is to distribute aid in affected disaster zones in less than 48 hours after the disaster strikes, arriving in the immediate wake of loss with crucial, life-saving aid.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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GEM prepositions emergency aid supplies such as non-perishable food items, water, hygiene products, and other lifesaving goods such as temporary shelters, generators and medical supplies. GEM also partners with local grass-roots organizations to further impact the communities affected by these disasters. GEM's average response time is 24-48

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

GEM implements a Family Necessity Kit program where those affected by disasters receive a box containing lifesaving food, hygiene products, and other forms of aid that can support a family of 4 for up to a week. GEM also implements a Relief Card program where those affected by disasters receive a pre-loaded gift card containing \$100-\$500 to be able to replace essential goods & supplies.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funds will serve the general population in Florida, specifically ensuring the residents receive the aid & assistance they need before and after disasters strike. GEM expects to serve nearly 1 million individuals in Florida annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

GEM expects to ensure that all Florida residents feel prepared and safe before disasters. GEM also expects all Florida residents are not left behind in the aftermath of destructive disasters, such as major hurricanes. These outcomes will be measured by the number of individuals GEM is able to serve in Florida annually.
