These funds will facilitate planning and initial construction for the FSU Northeast Campus Academic Corridor that will unite three academic colleges: the College of Fine Arts, the College of Motion Picture Arts, and the College of Music. This will also include space for the FSU "Flying High" Circus, Opening Nights, and the Maggie Allese National Center for Choreography (MANCC).

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The FSU Northeast Campus Academic Corridor would provide citizens with access to world-class cultural experiences and educational opportunities, which would help build a strong sense of community. This can be measured by attendance at events, feedback from the community, and the variety and quality of programming offered.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population are university students, K12 students and the general community as a whole, here in Leon county.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Northeast Campus Academic Corridor would provide educational opportunities not only for FSU students but also to students in neighboring K12 systems, who often come to campus for performances. This can be measured by the number of students who participate in these programs, and the impact on their knowledge and appreciation of the arts.
