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13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Expand the existing water safety field trip program to include all Marion County students grade 2-5. Provide critical water safety awareness and basic swimming instruction and teaches lifesaving skills, thereby reducing drowning deaths and promoting lifelong safety and confidence around water. Complement and continue the mission of the DOH swim voucher program (s. 514.073, F.S.) which ends at age 4, and satisfy the water safety & certification requirements of s. 1003.225, F.S.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities and services provided will include a 2-hour lesson designed to meet specific PE standards for water safety, focusing on Red Cross water safety lessons. Students will participate in a 1-hour swimming skills session tailored to their individual skill levels. Beginners will focus on foundational skills such as learning to float and blowing bubbles, while advanced swimmers will be taught lifesaving techniques and advanced swimming skills in all strokes. Each field trip will educate and train children in grades 2 through 5 on how to be safe in, on, and around water, ensuring they gain essential water safety knowledge and skills.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Provide direct services to citizens by offering water safety field trips for children in grades 2 through 5. These field trips will include a 2-hour water safety lesson aligned with specific PE standards and based on Red Cross water safety curriculum. Additionally, a 1-hour swimming skills session will be tailored to meet each child's skill level, ranging from foundational skills like floating and blowing bubbles for beginners to lifesaving techniques and advanced swimming skills for more experienced swimmers. These services aim to equip children with essential water safety knowledge and skills, promoting safety and confidence in, on, and around water.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Children in Public, Private and Charter schools in Marion County. Approximately 14,614 students would be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit or outcome of this project is to ensure that students in grades 2 through 5 gain critical water safety knowledge and swimming skills, making them safer and more confident in, on, and around water. The project aims to equip all participants with skills such as floating, blowing bubbles, lifesaving techniques, and recognizing and applying the "reach and throw, don't go" method for water rescues. The methodology for measuring this outcome includes tracking the number of students served during the 2-hour workshops and assessing their exit skills at the end of each field trip. Exit skills testing will evaluate each child's progress based on their starting skill level, ensuring measurable improvement in water safety awareness and swimming abilities. The best-case scenario would result in all 20,655 students becoming water-safe and proficient in essential water rescue techniques.
