This initiative would develop three regional waste glass processing facilities in Florida and create end markets for processed glass aggregate.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Collection of waste glass from curbside recycling programs and drop-off centers, and Goodwill donation off facilities and process waste glass to glass aggregate for use in concrete applications, road base applications as well as in septic drain field applications.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will provide direct environmental and economic benefits to Florida citizens by expanding access to convenient glass recycling services, reducing landfill disposal costs, and supporting local job creation. Residents will gain new opportunities to recycle household glass, while communities benefit from cleaner environments, improved waste management infrastructure, and locally produced recycled materials used in construction and manufacturing.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida Panhandle, Southeast and Southwest Florida residents. The total population as of the 2020 Census, was 1.5 million, 9.4 million and 2.2 million respectively. Using this figure, the regional populations as percentages of the state's total are: Florida Panhandle: Approximately 6.96%, Southeast Florida: Approximately 44.04%, and Southwest Florida: Approximately 6.99%.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will be able to process 10,000 tons of waste glass. This equates to avoided disposal cost savings of \$420,000 per year.

Total tons of materials diverted from landfill as well as the volume of processed glass aggregate created as a result of the project.
