The requested funds will be allocated to post-production activities for the series, ensuring the use of local facilities and professional expertise to achieve excellence in quality and the successful completion of both the scripted series and the educational documentary component.

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The funds will support post-production activities including editing, sound design, and voice recording utilizing local facilities. In addition, they will cover salaries for editors, consultants, and creative professionals, prioritizing the engagement of local expert talent to ensure a high-quality final product.

The project will provide direct educational and cultural benefits to Florida citizens by ensuring the authenticity and quality of a series that reflects the state's heritage and environment. The accompanying educational documentary, to be developed in collaboration with Florida educators and experts, will serve as a high-quality learning tool, designed to integrate seamlessly into school curriculums and community programs, inspiring students to engage with Florida's history, ecology, and culture.

It is expected to reach thousands statewide through the series and educational documentary, and to engage broader national and international audiences.
