13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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This funding will bridge the cost gap for kosher meal preparation, enabling the JCS Senior Meals Program to serve 800 seniors annually through home delivery and congregate sites with nutritionally equivalent meals that meet both dietary laws and nutritional standards. The purpose of the Senior Meals Program is to reduce food insecurity among seniors in Miami-Dade county by providing access to appropriate kosher meals that meet the Recommended Dietary Intake (DRI) guidelines.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Program provides culturally appropriate nutrition services to approximately 800 food-insecure seniors annually through Jewish Community Services of South Florida. Program funds offset higher kosher food costs, ensuring equal nutritional quality through home-delivered meals, congregate dining, and shelf-stable foods. This enables seniors to maintain their religious dietary requirements while aging with dignity at home, preventing costlier institutional care. No senior should compromise nutritional health due to religious observance.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

JCS provides kosher meals through home deliveries and at congregate meal sites, serving approximately 800 seniors annually. This ensures that older adults receive culturally appropriate, nutritious meals to support their well-being and dietary needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for these funds are homebound low-income seniors in Miami-Dade County who may be economically disadvantaged, in poor physical health, and physically disabled regardless of race, religion, ethnicity, or gender. We expect to serve approximately 800 seniors.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected Benefits/Outcomes: Senior clients will maintain nutritionally balanced diets and enhance their quality of life while aging in place with independence, reducing use of institutional/residential care. Participants will experience decreased food insecurity. Measurement Methodology: Social workers and support staff will conduct annual assessments of nutritional risk and evaluate health and wellness of each senior client. Clients will complete feedback surveys to measure food security and satisfaction.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
