	Inclusion Revolution's Integrated Jobs Program prepares and places adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) into competitive employment in Sarasota and Manatee counties. The program provides individualized job development, coaching, and ongoing support so participants can secure meaningful work, earn wages, and be fully included in workplaces. State funding will support a program administrator, job coaches, transportation, employer education, and wage support for paid internships when needed. These services reduce barriers that keep adults with IDD out of the workforce (employer readiness, individualized coaching, and transportation) and replace them with a supported pathway into jobs. The requested funds will allow Inclusion Revolution to serve approximately 70 participants from Sarasota and Manatee counties each year, match them with inclusive employers, and provide coaching needed to maintain employment and advance toward self-sufficiency.

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In lieu of state funding, Inclusion Revolution would seek increased support from private philanthropy, local government partners, and employer contributions. These sources, however, are not sufficient or predictable enough to sustain intensive job coaching, transportation supports, and employer training for adults with IDD across both counties. State funding provides the backbone of the program, allowing local philanthropy and employers to be leveraged for growth rather than core capacity.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funds will expand Inclusion Revolution's Integrated Jobs Program so that adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in Sarasota and Manatee counties can obtain and maintain competitive, integrated employment. The primary goal is to increase the number of participants with IDD who secure paid jobs in community businesses at or above minimum wage and who are still successfully employed at 6 and 12 months.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

- Outreach and intake for adults with IDD and their families in Sarasota and Manatee counties
- Individualized vocational assessment and job readiness planning
- Job development and employer matching based on participants' strengths, interests, and support needs
- On-site job coaching during onboarding and the first 90 days of employment, with tapering support as the participant gains independence
- Ongoing follow-along support to address any workplace issues and help participants advance in their roles
- Employer education and technical assistance on inclusive hiring, reasonable accommodations, and disability awareness ¿• Limited wage subsidies or paid internship support where needed to help new employers test a placement before permanent hire ¿• Data collection and reporting on employment outcomes, wages, hours, and retention

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services to citizens will include:

- · One-to-one job coaching and employment support for adults with IDD
- Assistance with job search, resume development, and interview practice
- On-site coaching during the first days and weeks of employment
- Ongoing individualized support to maintain employment, resolve issues, and build workplace social skills
- Guidance to families and caregivers on how to support employment success
- Disability-inclusive training and consultation directly to participating employers and their staff.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is adults (typically ages 18 and older) with intellectual and developmental disabilities living in Sarasota and Manatee counties who are seeking competitive, integrated employment. Many participants are low- to moderate-income, and most have experienced long-term exclusion from the workforce.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

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Expected benefits/outcomes include:

¿• Increased number of adults with IDD securing competitive, integrated jobs¿• Increased wages and hours worked for participants¿• Improved workplace social skills, independence, and self-confidence among participants¿• Increased number of employers in Sarasota and Manatee who successfully hire and retain employees with IDD¿• Reduced isolation and increased community inclusion for adults with IDD.

Measurement methodology:

- Tracking of job placements, wages, hours, and job type for each participant
- Employment retention measured at 3/6/12 months
- Number of employers engaged, trained, and employing individuals with IDD
- Pre- and post- surveys of participants (and/or families) measuring self-reported confidence, independence, and sense
 of belonging
- Employer satisfaction surveys assessing performance, retention, and likelihood of hiring additional participants
- Regular reporting on key metrics to state agency and the Florida Senate, as required

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Inclusion Revolution agrees that failure to meet agreed-upon performance measures may result in:

- · Withholding of a portion of remaining grant funds until corrective actions are implemented;
- Requirement to submit a corrective action plan with specific timelines; and
- Reduction of future-year funding recommendations if performance benchmarks are not met without good cause. Any such penalties would be in addition to the contracting agency's standard contract terms and conditions.
