#### 4. Project/Program Description

Design & construct drainage system on NE 94 St from NE 10 Ave & Belvedere Dr to N. Bayshore Dr to prevent ponding/standing water and water intrusion for proper drainage during rainfall events and high tide events as this flooding occurs approximately 1600 ft from the Biscayne Bay aquifer. This drainage system would allow the Village to capture water runoff and assure water quality contaminant predictability within the allowances of the NPDES guidelines before it reaches the Biscayne Bay aquifer.
