13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The BVFRD will acquire a 2,500-gallon pumper tanker for the purposes of maintaining a mobile strategic water reserve in rural northeastern Leon County where there are no fire hydrants. The funds will be allocated directly to the firefighting apparatus to replace a 20-year-old firefighting tanker that has become expensive to maintain for reliable in daily operation. The frequency and duration the current unit is out of service has put local residents at risk. When in service the safety of unit's steering and braking is of concern when in response mode.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The BVFRD will purchase a 2,500-gallon firefighting pumper tanker/tender to provide emergency structural and wild land fire suppression services to the residents of unincorporated Leon County. Additionally, this apparatus will be utilized to train the responders of the Bradfordville Volunteer Fire and Rescue department as well as new recruits to the fire service. The unit may be dispatched as part of mutual aid to territories within and outside of Leon County.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The BVFRD provides first response emergency medical and fire suppression services in northeast Leon County that is mixed urban, suburban, and rural. This firefighting unit (pumper tanker/tender will primarily serve a rural area of the county where residents are not serviced by a manned fire station or operational fire hydrants. This tanker will prove valuable with fire suppression to an area for which the next nearest pumper tanker/tender is 18.7 miles (25 minutes) away.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The BVFRD provides first response emergency medical and fire suppression services in NE Leon County (County) consisting of mixed urban, suburban, and rural. This pumper tanker/tender will primarily serve a rural area of the county where residents are not serviced by a manned fire station or operational fire hydrants. This tanker will prove valuable as immediate target population is unincorporated northeast Leon County consisting of approximately 12,500 residential structures. This number does not include commercial, government, educational, and agricultural structures in the area served. The secondary target will be the broader unincorporated Leon County Florida of 100.55 square miles with a population of 25,373 residents (2015) and 9,857 residences. Finally, by mutual aid request, the apparatus will service residents of neighboring Gadsden County Florida, providing fire suppression to an area for which the next nearest pumper tanker/tender is 18.7 miles (25 minutes) away.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The planned expected outcome will be the BVRFD receives a 2,500-gallon tanker capable of pumping 1,250gpms to provide fire suppression and support to the residents of Leon County. The benefit of this apparatus will be immeasurable due to the nature of structural and wildland fire incidents. Its value will be determined in two ways: (1) during fire suppression efforts, water will be readily available through this capable apparatus in areas not serviced by fire hydrants; and (2) insurance ratings may drop for residents due to the type of apparatus stationed near their personal residences. The matrices for which success will be measured is a decrease in the frequency and duration the unit is out of service as compared to the current unit.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Failure to deliver a constructed vehicle on time and on budget may result in the BVRFD denying future contracts with the vendor and also reserving the right to find a new vendor to fulfill the vehicle order if required.
