13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds received will be utilized to create community-based circles of support in rural counties with the purpose of stabilizing families to prevent child abuse and deflect families from unnecessarily entering into the child welfare dependency system. Families who are otherwise isolated will be connected with supportive volunteers in their own communities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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SFFC (an evidence-based Family First Prevention program) will hire staff in rural counties to engage faith and community partners. SFFC will recruit, vet and oversee volunteers to support at risk families with children ages 0-18. Funds will also cover background checks, liability insurance and training for volunteers who are directly serving local families.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services include temporary child hosting, parent mentoring, transportation, day time child care and connection to resources. These connections result in long term, natural relationships which outlast the need for formal support thus, the family experiences a decrease in social isolation and an increase in safety and stability.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target populations for this project include jobless persons, economically disadvantaged person, at-risk youth, homeless persons, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, victims of crime, and single parents with children under the age of 18.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The family being served will experience an increase in their own Protective Factors which in turn will prevent any possibility of child abuse occurring. The extended family-like relationships built with volunteers will resolve that family's social isolation. Parent mentors will identify and develop a goal plan which will help the family become both stable and successful. SFFC will use the PFS2 assessment to monitor the progress of the family.
