13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used to construct a new, regulation grade, athletic track with an all-weather synthetic surface. This project will provide a safe, durable, and accessible facility for athletic events, physical education classes, and community use. The goal is to enhance student participation in athletics and expand opportunities for school and community events.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Project activities include the demolition and removal of the existing grass and soil base, installation of a proper drainage and subbase system and construction of a high-quality synthetic track surface that meets Florida High School Athletic Association guidelines. The completed facility will support school athletic practices, physical education instruction, district-level competitions, and community fitness and recreation programs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will provide direct access to a safe and modern athletic track for students, staff, and the surrounding community. Citizens will benefit through opportunities for organized youth sports, local athletic events, walking and fitness activities, and community gatherings. The facility will serve as a shared resource promoting health, wellness and engagement across all age groups.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is our 997 middle and high school students who participate in athletics, physical education and extracurricular activities. In addition, the estimated number of local youth leagues and community groups annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome is a restored, modernized athletic track. Benefits include reduced maintenance costs, increased facility availability for athletics, physical education and community events year round. Outcomes will be measured by:

- * Completion of project within the project timeline
- * Number of athletic events successfully hosted on the new surface
- * User feedback from students, staff and community groups
