The funds requested will restore and modernized the football field that was severely damaged by Hurricane Helene. It will ensure that students and the community can once again have access to a safe, functional and storm-resilient facility through installation of a durable turf surface.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The project will include the removal of the storm damaged natural grass field and installation of a turf playing surface. This will ensure that the athletic field can support athletic programs, physical education classes, extracurricular events and community activities year-round.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide students, families and community members with a safe and reliable venue for athletic programs, physical education, extracurricular events, and community gatherings. The upgraded turf field will expand opportunities for youth sports, school events and recreational use.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is our 997 middle and high school students who participate in athletics, physical education and extracurricular activities. In addition, the XXXX estimated number of local youth leagues and community groups annually.
