The additional funds will allow ZeroEyes to double the number of cameras monitored for guns on campus - creating a safer school environment.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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ZeroEyes will add server capacity and begin monitoring double the amount of cameras across the district for brandished firearms, and providing 24/7 human verification monitoring, troubleshooting / maintenance, quarterly software updates.

Citizens with children enrolled in the district will benefit with the added layer of protection at their kid's schools, while also making the schools not appear like a heavily guarded facility because the software layer sits on top of the already existing camera infrastructure.

The target population includes students, teachers, and staff that work and learn within the district.
