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Gulf County will implement construction methods that emphasize quality, durability, efficiency, sustainability, and this project will also be designed to incorporate principles of resilience and mitigation against the impact of future disasters. This project is designed to help mitigate the increasing threat of coastal flooding due to weather events by providing additional evacuation opportunities for residents from future severe tropical weather events. It will also serve as a staging area for post-disaster recovery operations, including air-lifts of critical supplies and arrival of first responders. With the anticipation and understanding of future coastal flooding hazards, new transportation and airport infrastructure will increase evacuation opportunities for residents of Gulf County and will enhance emergency response capabilities in the aftermath of a natural disaster.

The project will provide the general public with the benefit of accessible aviation, which is specially rare in this region of Florida.
