### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Currently, Gulf County's firefighters must travel significant distances-often out of the county- for essential training, which limits opportunities and coordinated response practice. Smaller volunteer departments in fiscally constrained counties are especially disadvantaged. This local facility will help create a dedicated training site that allows for hands on training for the region. By centralizing training in Gulf County, the program will reduce travel costs for rural departments, standardizes training quality, and enhances regional emergency preparedness.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This facility will be dedicated exclusively to the training and certification of volunteer firefighters, beginning with a targeted recruitment and training program for high school seniors in partnership with the Gulf County School Board. Additionally, all nine Gulf County volunteer fire departments will also be able to train new recruits and hold necessary training exercises at the new facility.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The establishment of the Gulf County Regional Firefighter Training Facility represents a transformative opportunity to meet a pressing community need with long-term benefits for public safety, youth development, and regional resilience.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The entire population of Gulf County will benefit from this training facility as more trained firefighter will benefit the County as a whole. The current population of Gulf County is 16,947. This facility will be dedicated exclusively to the training and certification of volunteer firefighters, beginning with a targeted recruitment and training program for high school seniors in partnership with the Gulf County School Board. Additionally, all nine Gulf County volunteer fire departments will be able to train new recruits and hold training exercises at the new facility.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The establishment of the Gulf County Regional Firefighter Training Facility represents a transformative opportunity to meet a pressing community need with long-term benefits for public safety, youth development, and regional resilience. Once operational, the training facility will be sustained through partnerships with local government agencies, volunteer fire departments, and school districts. The initial high school program will serve as a model for expansion into neighboring counties, with the long-term goal of creating a regional training hub for the tri-county area.
