a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Southern Shakespeare Company is seeking state appropriations to expand the reach of our Free Shakespeare in the Park Festival to an event recognized state-wide and to fulfill our mission to maximize reach to the underrepresented students throughout the state of Florida. Our focus remains on delivery of educational resources and performing arts experiences that support the Florida BEST standards (English Language Arts).



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Southern Shakespeare Company will produce multiple theatrical events which are made widely accessible to the community and attractive to visitors. We will also develop and provide a multitude of educational resources such as workshops, camps, field trip opportunities, and training sessions for teachers, students, and members of the community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

With shuttles to and from handicap parking areas, a designated American Sign Language interpreted performance, free entry to our Festival and our newest endeavor to include a described performance for the visually impaired, Southern Shakespeare Company continues to work to foster the accessibility and availability of our programming to the entire community. We work year-round in title I schools.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Southern Shakespeare Company engages with over 50,000 individuals yearly including those from the elderly community, economically disadvantaged, at-risk youth, physically disabled individuals, students, and incarcerated persons.

Improved mental health, enrichment from cultural experiences, improved quality of education, increased economic activity and tourism - measured through Downes & St. Germain Economic Impact Reports, post-event surveys and focus-groups held with educators and students.
