### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The specific purpose of the requested funds is to provide a down payment for the replacement of Ladder 7, the St. George Island Volunteer Fire Department's 25-year-old aerial apparatus, which has reached the end of its reliable service life. The proposed replacement—a 2029 E-One 100' RM Aerial Platform—will ensure continued operational readiness, enhance firefighter safety, and bring the department into compliance with current National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards. This investment directly supports the department's ability to respond effectively to structural fires, rescue operations, and life safety emergencies in a remote coastal community where dependable equipment is essential.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

To meet the intended purpose of replacing the St. George Island Volunteer Fire Department's aging aerial apparatus, the requested funds will support the following activities and services:

- Procurement Coordination: Initiating the purchase process for the 2029 E-One 100' RM Aerial Platform, including securing the down payment and finalizing vendor agreements.
- Compliance Assurance: Ensuring the new apparatus meets current National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards for aerial equipment, firefighter safety, and operational readiness.
- Operational Integration: Preparing the department for deployment of the new unit, including training, equipment transfer, and readiness testing.

These activities will directly support public safety and emergency preparedness for residents and visitors of St. George Island.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The 2029 E-One 100' RM Aerial Platform truck is essential to meeting both the current and future operational needs of the St. George Island Volunteer Fire Department. This modern aerial apparatus will significantly enhance the department's ability to respond effectively to emergency situations, particularly in a community where 96% of single-family dwellings (1,539 out of 1,602) are two stories or taller. St. George Island's unique vertical residential profile demands specialized equipment capable of reaching elevated structures quickly and safely. The new aerial platform will ensure timely access for fire suppression and rescue operations, improve firefighter safety, and maintain compliance with National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards, ultimately safeguarding lives and property in this geographically isolated coastal community.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The St. George Island Volunteer Fire Department serves a year-round population of approximately 1,100 residents and over 20,000 annual tourists, providing critical emergency response services in a geographically isolated coastal community. Franklin County has only two aerial apparatus units—one operated by SGI VFD and the other by Carrabelle VFD. If either unit is out of service, the county must rely on mutual aid from neighboring jurisdictions, which significantly increases response times and reduces fire ground efficiency. Replacing SGI's aging aerial truck with a modern, NFPA-compliant apparatus will ensure uninterrupted service, enhance firefighter safety, and maintain rapid, effective emergency response capabilities for the thousands of individuals who live in or visit the island each year.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is the successful acquisition and deployment of a modern, NFPA-compliant aerial apparatus that replaces the aging Ladder 7 unit and restores full operational readiness to the St. George Island Volunteer Fire Department. This will improve emergency response times, enhance firefighter safety, and ensure reliable service for the island's 1,100 residents and 20,000+ annual visitors. Success will be measured through completion of the purchase, compliance verification, operational testing, reduced reliance on mutual aid, and documented improvements in incident response capability.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Franklin County will work with the contracting agency to determine applicable measures should funding be made available.
