13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The purpose of this project is to deliver statewide K–8 financial literacy instruction that builds early money-management skills, strengthens long-term workforce readiness, and expands economic mobility in rural and economically disadvantaged communities. Funds will support in-school lessons, budgeting and saving simulations, early entrepreneurship activities, parent engagement workshops, and a financial literacy app for students. This initiative complements existing Florida Department of Education priorities by providing hands-on, age-appropriate financial literacy instruction not currently offered statewide for K–8 students, extending DOE's goals into communities that historically lack consistent access to enrichment programming.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will support in-school and after-school financial literacy lessons, budgeting and saving simulations, early entrepreneurship projects, teacher support materials, parent engagement workshops, and use of the Money Smart Kids app to reinforce learning and track student progress.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services include age-appropriate financial education for K–8 students through interactive lessons, hands-on money activities, and guided use of a financial literacy app, as well as parent sessions that help families support healthy financial habits at home.

Teacher feedback forms and parent surveys.

Annual outcome report submitted to the Department of Education.

Approximately 1,800–2,000 K–8 students statewide in FY 2026–2027.
