### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The project will renovate Gretchen Everhart School's outdoor play areas, which are currently inaccessible, outdated, and unsafe. Existing equipment and surfaces prevent students with profound disabilities from active play. Funds will create a fully accessible, inclusive, and safe outdoor space with adaptive equipment, sensory areas, and accessible pathways that support physical, social, and emotional development.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Activities will include the removal of outdated, inaccessible equipment and installation of new ADA-compliant play structures, sensory and mobility features, and accessible surfacing. Services will include design, site preparation, construction, and safety inspection.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide direct services to students with disabilities by giving them safe, accessible opportunities for physical activity, social interaction, sensory engagement, and therapeutic play. It will offer an inclusive environment that supports development, independence, and well-being, directly enhancing the daily educational and recreational experiences of the school community.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

"The target population is students at Gretchen Everhart School with profound physical, cognitive, and sensory disabilities. The playground will serve approximately 100 students annually, providing an inclusive environment that supports physical activity, social interaction, and overall development.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

An accessible playground improves physical health by encouraging movement that builds strength, balance, coordination, and endurance. For students with disabilities, it provides safe opportunities for therapeutic exercise that supports mobility goals and reduces sedentary behavior. Regular play enhances cardiovascular health, flexibility, and motor planning, while fostering independence and physical confidence. Measured outcomes will include improvements in mobility, balance, coordination, and strength as documented by physical or occupational therapists; increased duration and frequency of active play; reduced sedentary time; achievement of individualized therapy goals.
