	The Infinite Spectrum Foundation provides hands-on creative media and workforce training for neurodiverse youth to empower individuals on the autism spectrum through confidence building and skill development. Participants learn filmmaking, content creation, graphic design, and/or podcasting while strengthening communication, social skills, and teamwork. The program also offers access to essential technology such as cameras, iPads, and audio equipment that many families cannot afford. Each student completes projects that build a digital portfolio and prepare them for future employment opportunities. Funding will support instructors, equipment, and program operations to serve youth across Leon County and expand meaningful pathways to independence.

The funds will be used to provide direct educational, creative, and skill-building programs for individuals on the autism spectrum in Leon County, preparing them for meaningful career opportunities in media, marketing, and storytelling.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Programs run for seven weeks and focus on content creation, storytelling, branding, filmmaking, and podcasting. Students receive hands-on tech and media training, social skill development, paid internship stipends, and one-time business incentives. Programs are led by certified instructors and guest mentors, offering both structured classes and individualized guidance.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Participants gain access to professional equipment, software, and materials, allowing them to build digital portfolios, showcase their work publicly, and develop confidence and community engagement. Mentorship and career support help prepare participants for internships and future employment opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project serves teens and young adults on the autism spectrum, ages 12–22, in Leon County, with approximately 30 - 45 individuals expected to engage annually across all programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Participants will gain technical expertise, creative storytelling and marketing skills, and professional readiness. Outcomes will be measured through completed digital portfolios, certifications earned, internship placements, job placements, and participant and family feedback.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Infinite Spectrum Foundation is committed to meeting all deliverables and performance measures outlined in this project. In addition to any standard penalties the Agency for Persons with Disabilities may apply, suggested measures could include corrective action plans, regular progress reporting, and reallocation of funds for specific unmet objectives. The Foundation will proactively work with APD to identify and resolve any performance issues promptly to ensure the program meets its intended outcomes.
