### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will be used to complete construction of new research and instructional space for the Florida A&M University College of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences. The project will expand laboratory capacity to advance pharmacy education, biomedical research, and workforce development in Florida's growing healthcare sector.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Funds will support construction, renovation, and equipment installation for modern laboratories and classrooms. These facilities will foster hands-on research, interdisciplinary instruction, and experiential learning that prepare students for licensure, clinical practice, and leadership in pharmaceutical and public health professions.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will expand training and clinical research opportunities for pharmacy and public health students, enabling them to provide community health outreach, medication counseling, and disease prevention services. It will also enhance partnerships with healthcare providers and expand access to health resources for underserved populations.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project serves FAMU students pursuing pharmacy, public health, and biomedical degrees; faculty conducting applied health research; and Florida communities benefiting from outreach and service programs. The expanded facility is expected to directly serve more than 800 students and faculty annually and indirectly benefit thousands through community health engagement.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will boost degree production in high-demand health fields, increase research output, and strengthen Florida's healthcare workforce. Success will be measured by higher graduation and licensure rates, growth in funded research and publications, and expanded partnerships and service hours in community health programs.
