13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Carrabelle Post Office was constructed in 1961 in a Mid-Century Modern style. It features a one-story design with decorated exterior brick. The front of the building has a floor-to-ceiling wall of glass that serves as its entryway. Additionally, there are eight awning-type windows, four on each side of the building. The building's low-profile, shallowpitch roofline adds to its retro charm. Inside, the design emphasizes clean lines and minimal decoration, which remains influential in modern architecture.

The post office in Carrabelle has had four locations. The first one was established in 1878, three years before the town was officially founded in 1881. It was immediately leased to the United States Postal Service on September 30, 1961, under the leadership of President John F. Kennedy, Postmaster General J. Edward Day, and Deputy Postmaster General H. W.

Brawley. Today, sixty-three years later, the partnership continues.
