The Florida agriculture and related industry generates over \$182.6 billion in revenue annually with the equine industry generating \$12.8 billion. With this, there is definitely a need for Agriculture Centers in the state with an emphasis on the showing of livestock. The addition of a covered seating area at the Heritage Pavilion will enable the County to host events in inclement weather. The County will have the assistance of the Chamber of Commerce and Tourism Development to bring multi-day events to a fiscally constrained area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The County will be working with Taylor County Chamber of Commerce and Tourism Development to bring multi-day events to the Center and Heritage Pavilion. As the County is rural and the economy being largely based on agriculture, there is a great deal of interest in hosting events at the Park. The Park improvements will enable multiple events over multiple days to be hosted thus promoting tourism and economic development.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services will provide the opportunity for all ages and abilities to participate in or spectate agricultural, livestock, and entertainment events in a safe, family friendly environment. The Ag Center will provide the County the facility and resources needed to host multi-day events and activities. The covered seating area at the Heritage Pavilion will also encourage multi-day events thus increased tourism development opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is citizens who participate or enjoy being spectators at agriculture and livestock activities as well as entertainment events. Quite a few local children participate in 4-H and showing livestock and as there are no facilities available in the County at this time, they must travel outside the County to participate in these events and activities. The County's primary goal is to host multi-day agriculture, livestock, and entertainment events and shows to promote tourism and economic development.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The outcome will be the ability to host multi-day agricultural, livestock, and entertainment events. With the steel covering, over the arena and covered seating at the Heritage Pavilion, inclement weather will not have a negative impact on events hosted at the facility. As a fiscally constrained County which has suffered catastrophic losses from Hurricane's Idalia and Helene and the loss of the two primary employers, tourism and economic development is critical for the area.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Taylor County is committed to developing the arena in to an Agricultural Center. All performance measures and deliverables will be met within the funding contract guidelines. Taylor County received a \$200,000 FRDAP grant in 2024 to completely rehabilitate the arena and this will be complete prior to installation of the steel covering. Covered seating at the Heritage Pavilion will allow for increased events and tourism opportunities at the Park.
