c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Funding this project will provide direct access to high-speed rail services for Cocoa residents by connecting Clearlake Road to the future Cocoa Brightline Multimodal Station, enabling easier travel to Orlando and South Florida. It will also improve local mobility, traffic flow, and safety through the addition of a modern roadway, sidewalks, and multimodal access.

The general public to include residents and business owners along the corridor and tourists riding the Brightline Train. This expansion will directly impact hundreds of thousands of individuals that will utilize this corridor.
