### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project will allow Osceola County to advance the construction of 2 ramps at the Waterlin Boulevard Interchange which will provide critical new access to Florida's Turnpike in southern Osceola County, addressing one of the longest gaps between exits on any U.S. limited access facility, approximately 50 miles between exit locations. This investment will provide immediate congestion relief, improve safety, support regional growth, and generate significant new toll revenue for Florida's Turnpike Enterprise.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The Waterlin Boulevard Interchange project will construct a half diamond interchange on Florida's Turnpike at the Waterlin Boulevard overpass, which is under design and planned for construction in Summer 2026. Construction of the interchange includes providing a northbound on-ramp and a southbound off-ramp.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Waterlin Boulevard Interchange provides a proactive solution to meet near-term demand before the long-planned future Southport Connector or Mildred Bass Boulevard interchanges come online (15+ years out).

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Current residents of St. Cloud, the Waterlin Mixed Use District, Canoe Creek Reserve, Lake Gentry Landings, and Southern Osceola County will be served by the construction of this project. Over ninety-one thousand (91,000) residential units, forty-five million (45M) square feet of non-residential (commercial/industrial) space, and over five thousand (5,000) hotel rooms are anticipated in this area by year 2040.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefits of the project will be manifested in improved transportation conditions, improved economic activity and job opportunities, diversification of the County's tourism-dependent economy, enhanced individual economic self-sufficiency, less traffic congestion, less stress, improves emergency response times, evacuation route connection, and system reliability.
