13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Our goals are to:

- 1) Reduce recidivism
 2) Promote personal growth
 3) Strengthen community safety through moral education, peer mentorship, counseling, and career development linkages, the program transforms confinement into a classroom of change.

Our target population is youth between the ages of 10 and 17, at risk youth, and incarcerated adults (previous and present).



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will support program operations delivered by our multidisciplinary team of psychologists, social workers, educators, and other specialists to provide mental health care, parent training, career development, and rapport-building activities. They will also strengthen our referral coordination, employment collaborations, and seamless support from jail to probation and beyond.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

With this funding, we will provide pro bono, comprehensive support to justice involved youth and adults. Services include counseling, substance-abuse support, parental skills training, and one-on-one mentorship. Youth will receive real-world career preparation, opportunities to build trust through sports and other activities, and direct help accessing resources essential to their success.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our target population is youth between the ages of 10 and 17, at risk youth, and incarcerated adults (previous and present).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Proposed Performance Measure: 70 % of program participants shall achieve or maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher, or will show an increase in their cumulative grade point average, from the first semester or previous year.

Proposed Measurement Tool: Report Cards, School Records, homework completed, and teacher assessments

Proposed Frequency of Data Collection: Weekly, monthly, and quarterly
