4. Project/Program Description

Requested funds will be utilized to implement and expand the Amigos LEAD (Learning, Enrichment & Academic Development) Program, a comprehensive, high-quality after-school and summer initiative designed to provide essential academic support and enrichment opportunities for children and youth, including students with disabilities. This program aims to create a safe, engaging environment where participants can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally. The program serves up to 200 students in grades K-5 during the academic year, offering activities tailored to their developmental needs. These activities will include academic tutoring, STEM-based projects, arts and cultural exploration, and social-emotional learning opportunities. A key feature of the program is its incorporation of youth voice and choice, empowering students to actively participate in their learning experiences. Summer programming will expand to 60 students in grades K-8, focusing on combating learning losses.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will be used to achieve the goal of expanding and enhancing the Amigos LEAD (Learning, Enrichment & Academic Development) Program, a free, high-quality after-school and summer program designed to address educational disparities and provide meaningful enrichment opportunities for underserved children and youth. Specifically, the funds will support the following purposes: 1. Increase Access: Serve 200 students in grades K-5 during the school year and 60 students in grades K-8 during the summer, providing a safe and nurturing environment for academic support and personal development. 2. Enhance Programming: Offer engaging activities, including STEM education, arts and cultural exploration, social-emotional learning, and recreation, while incorporating youth voice and choice to foster student engagement and empowerment. 3. Combat Learning Loss: Address academic gaps and prevent summer learning loss through targeted tutoring and hands-on enrichment

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

200 students during the school year (K-5) and 60 students during summer (K-8) will be provided with homework assistance (school year only), differentiated literacy instruction (DLI) (school year only), field trips, STEM (Coding, Engineering, Cooking & Gardening), Sports (Flag Football, Soccer, Basketball), Art (Visual Art, Theater, Dance), Service Learning Projects. Program is free to participants.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Amigos LEAD After School Program is dedicated to providing a safe, supportive, and enriching environment for children and youth during their out-of-school hours. The program encompasses a wide range of activities designed to promote academic growth, social development, and creative expression. The program's diverse offerings are aimed at catering to individual interests and needs, ensuring that participants have the opportunity to explore and develop their talents and skills. The Amigos LEAD After School Program places a strong emphasis on creating a positive and inclusive atmosphere where students can thrive academically, physically, and artistically. By offering a variety of enriching activities and ensuring students have a voice in their learning, the program supports their holistic development, fostering well- rounded individuals who are prepared for future success.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

200 students during the school year (K-5) and 60 during summer (K-8) in low income neighborhoods of Little Havana, Allapattah and surrounding areas.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Assessments:

- The physical fitness level of students participating in sports enrichment is gauged using the Progressive Aerobic Cardiovascular Endurance Run (PACER) test.
- Literacy levels are assessed using the Oral Reading Fluency (ORF) and the Maze assessments.
- The qualitative assessment of enrichments is conducted through showcases, performances, and portfolios, allowing students to demonstrate their learning and creative growth.
