13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The LeMieux Center for Public Policy will be located in the Rinker College of Business building and will serve students and the public by providing a space for reasoned, thoughtful, and civil discourse on pressing public policy issues confronting Florida, the United States, and the world. In existence for 12 years, The LeMieux Center for Public Policy has a speaker series and fellows program which tackle significant public policy issues. The Rinker College of Business is AACSB accredited.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Named for the former U.S. Senator from Florida, George LeMieux, the LeMieux Center for Public Policy provides opportunities and connections to instill civil discourse on topics of importance for Floridians. Students learn directly from esteemed policy experts and global thought leaders from a broad spectrum of disciplines. This experience offers a higher level of preparation for a future in areas such as public policy, law, business and servant leadership.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The LeMieux Center for Public Policy hosts nationally and internationally known speakers who provide their insights to the public policy world. Hosted by Palm Beach Atlantic University, the public forums are free of charge and open to all Floridians. In addition to the live, in-person events, PBA also records interviews with leading experts and thinkers. A library of the videos is also made available to the public.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Palm Beach Atlantic University (PBA) students are the primary population; however, The LeMieux Center also serves local tri-county residents through events, social media, website, The Quill podcast and publication all free of charge to Floridians.

The target audience consists of PBA's student body totaling 4,271 for 2025-26, friends of PBA via communications/mailings totaling over 24,000, and the tri-county resident population who could attend any of the events free of charge or access LeMieux publications or videos totaling 6.4 million residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this proposal is to deepen public discourse around pressing policy issues. The mission of the Center is to position itself as a leading center of excellence in the State. The Center also wishes to be known as a place of reason, thoughtful, and civil discourse. This is achieved through programming that includes thought leaders and the public, brought together to grapple with these issues. The Center also uses social media to amplify its impact throughout the State in an effort to be accessible to all Floridians without charge. A center is successful when all goals are achieved, enhancing its reputation as a trusted source on policy debates.
