13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Creation of a destination site for tourists & students seeking entertainment & education, themed around the object lessons of historical events demonstrating Florida's commitment to Americanism ideals, including patriotism, citizenship & liberty's cause. It will become a focal point for tourists & students of all ages to learn about state & local history against the backdrop of world history & global conflict. It will help to make history come alive by serving as a tangible example of mobilization & conversion of industry to defeat global totalitarianism.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Design & construction of the infrastructure & thematic enhancements found in the project description to create a civic, cultural and educational enhancement of value to Florida tourists visiting the capital city & to students of all ages studying American history, Americanism, foundational principles of liberty, civic education and citizenship.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A walkable landmark suitable for self-guided tours. The welcome center offers necessary amenities such as bathrooms, water fountains, benches and other comforts and will display WW II artifacts of direct interest. Trained TSC student docents and museum volunteers will provide guided tours to visitors on request.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Teachers & students seeking field trips to historical sites and historical tourism visitors. This project aligns with Florida's emphasis on Americanism and civics literacy through education. Tallahassee State College has approximately 15,000 students alone and opened a K-12 charter school in 2023. Approximately 55,000 students attend Florida State University, Florida A&M University and Lively Technical College. Leon County K-12 enrollment is nearly 33,000 at 57 schools. Visit Tallahassee 2020 economic study showed 7% of tourists (approx.118,000) to the Capital City visited historical amenities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Placemaking, education and economic development - Celebrating the connectedness and heritage of a state or locality and what makes it unique, improves community pride, overall life satisfaction and well-being. This is an untold chapter in our state's and capital city's storybook and celebrated heritage. Visit Tallahassee 2020 economic study showed 7% of tourists (approx.118,000) to the Capital City visited historical amenities. Visit Florida affirms the value of military history, see https://www.visitflorida.com/things-to-do/military/. A major growth strategy of local government is "placemaking" through cultural amenities, see https://www.talgov.com/place/pln-placemaking. We will work with Visit Tallahassee to be included in their collection and reporting of community economic health. We will track student volunteerism, conduct public opinion surveys, and collect engagement metrics.
