CodeBoxx will host 12-15 boot camps with cohorts of 20-25 participants each, as well as courses in critical technology sectors including AI and cybersecurity, leading to immediate employment and long-term financial security for 200+ Florida residents. 85% of CodeBoxx graduates who have completed the program have been placed in jobs immediately upon graduation at partner companies such as eBay, Humana, Spontivly Bedrock, iDimension, RevStar, and even CodeBoxx.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

CodeBoxx will host technology boot camps, develop AI-focused courses, provide cybersecurity training and other specialized tracks in high-demand fields and early tech and AI training for high school students to build diverse pathways to meaningful employment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

200+ individuals will be equipped to enter the technology workforce supported by essential wrap-around services including career training, job placement, ongoing mentor support and case management, ensuring comprehensive support throughout their training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Agile training programs like CodeBoxx help residents—including youth and underserved populations—adapt quickly to shifting economic conditions. Offering a faster, more affordable alternative to traditional degree paths, CodeBoxx supports underemployed and career-changing adults while advancing Florida's goal of becoming the nation's leader in workforce education—producing job-ready technologists who strengthen the state's innovation economy and resilience to economic change.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

CodeBoxx anticipates that state funding would provide immediate employment leading to long-term financial security for over 200+ Florida residents. This outcome will be measured through employment placement of students. With state support, 300+ students have been served through CodeBoxx programs to date, with 85% of graduates placed in jobs immediately upon graduation at partner companies such as eBay, Humana, Spontivly Bedrock, iDimension, RevStar, and even CodeBoxx itself.
