13. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Goodwill Pathways program assists survivors of human trafficking, helping them plan for their futures once initial stabilization services have taken place. Our goal is to meet the individualized needs of survivors by offering life skills and career development opportunities. Job Placement is the measured goal.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Intake, assessment, substance abuse and mental heath counseling, life skills coaching, parenting, financial literacy, educational skills development and referral and job placement activities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

In our second year, we'll continue walking alongside survivors of human trafficking, providing the comprehensive, trauma-informed support they need to heal, rebuild, and thrive.

Specific services include:

Assessment of skills and abilities

Development of personal, educational and career goals with an eye toward achieving family-sustaining employment. This will include facilitated work experience and/or short-term, skill-specific training, when appropriate.

Life Coaching and case management

Resource development to address barriers to success

Career Navigation

Soft skills training and coaching

Upskilling and reskilling through skill-specific credentialing

Training on basic skills

Digital literacy

Financial literacy

Parenting skills

GED

Workforce credentialing – through referrals or vouchers

Job placement and ongoing follow-up and follow-along

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The program will serve individuals who are victims of human trafficking who have reached stabilization (i.e. are no longer under the human trafficker's control). We anticipate serving 60-75 additional individuals in Year 2. This is based on the current wait list from year 1.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Goodwill's previous capacity building and operations in this sector have substantiated that life skills and career development are critical for the successful transition of victims of human trafficking. Victims receive intensive assessments and life coaching and career development, emphasizing up skilling and re-skilling. Goodwill will supplement these services with substance abuse, mental health counseling, and parenting with family reunification. All services are offered using motivational interviewing and active listening techniques. and by applying a variety of modalities through a trauma-informed, victim- centered, and survivor-informed lens. Goodwill will analyze strategies and track outcomes of the program, both at the participant and systemic level. Participant demographic, process and outcome data will be tracked to evaluate the program's effectiveness, efficiency, accessibility, the satisfaction of key stakeholders, and the impact of services.
