a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To help alleviate the growing waiting lists for adult forensic beds, Twin Oaks Juvenile Development is prepared to construct an additional cottage dedicated exclusively to direct file youth. This expansion will ensure that these individuals are housed separately from non-direct file youth, in accordance with safety and legal requirements. Currently, direct file youth must be segregated from both adult populations and youth with less severe charges, a situation that contributes to the backlog and increased demand for limited adult forensic bed space.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In addition to competency restoration services youth will receive educational, mental health, medical, vocational, and when the need requires will receive transitional services to ensure a smooth return to their home community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This program would assist the judicial system in order for these youth to be held accountable through the judicial process.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All youth who are direct-filed in adult court who are still under the age of 18 years of age who are deemed incompetent to proceed.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Due to this being the only program of its type in the nation the provider would not recommend any additional outcome measures other than those which are standard in State issued contracts.
