a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project will adapt the flood-vulnerable West Avenue neighborhood, making it resilient to future sea level rise and storm related threats. Roads will be elevated by approximately 24 inches, protecting them from high and rising tides. Storm water infrastructure across the neighborhood will be upgraded with new drainage, backup power generators, and larger pipe connections.. A water quality treatment system will filter stormwater, reducing it of pollutants.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will support construction activities and public services that directly advance the State's goals of reducing flood risk, improving water quality, and strengthening neighborhood resilience.

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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will provide Miami Beach residents, tourists and visitors with reliable flood protection, upgraded water and sewer services, & enhanced public safety. Funding will allow the elevation of frequently flooded streets, install new drainage systems, improve water and sewer lines to reduce service interruptions enhance stormwater treatment and ensure pump stations remain operational.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents, tourists, and visitors to the Greater Miami Beach Community. (80,000 residents) and annual tourists.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will significantly improve transportation conditions throughout the West Avenue corridor by ensuring that streets remain safe, accessible, and operational during rain events, king tides, and future sea level rise. Measuring flood reduction performance, water quality improvements, drinking and wastewater improvements, residents quality of life. All metrics will be documented, inspected, and operational reporting.
